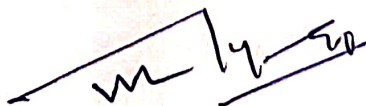
2. Confirmation of minutes of 13th IQAC meeting held on July 12, 2025:

4. University Recognition/Collaborations:

- JUET, Guna has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with SkillDzire Technologies Private Limited on 30 July 2025 to promote skill-based training, industry-oriented learning, internships, Faculty Development Programmes (FDPs), workshops, and other collaborative activities aimed at enhancing students' employability.
- JUET, Guna has entered into a Service Agreement with GeeksforGeeks on 08 October 2025 to provide students with access to Learning Management System (LMS)-based DSA learning resources, recorded course content, assessments, hackathons, and certification programmes to enhance technical skills and placement readiness.



- JUET, Guna has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with HRFY.ai – India's First AI-Powered Placement Lab on 14 October 2025 to strengthen AI-driven placement preparation through mock interviews, resume analytics, behavioural assessment, and interview readiness programmes for students.

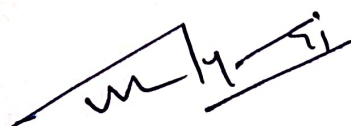
9. Interactions:

i. Interactions with Statutory Bodies

13. Outreach Activities:

- An Orientation Programme on Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) was organized as part of Deeksharambh (Student Induction Programme) during July 15–26, 2025, to familiarize newly admitted students with the objectives of UBA and motivate them to become volunteers. A poster-making competition on the theme "Social Hackathon" was also organized as part of the programme.

- UBA teams visited Sar Sahela and Raghunathpura villages on September 11, 2025, where students, faculty and staff interacted with villagers, discussed literacy with women and children, and conducted awareness sessions on nutrition and healthy living.
- A Blood Donation Camp was organized by the JUET Medical Center in association with the Red Cross Society and Government Hospital, Guna on September 15, 2025, during which 79 units of blood were donated by students, faculty and staff members.
- An Awareness Programme on Digital Literacy and Digital Public Infrastructure was conducted at Achkalpur Village under Sewa Parv-2025 on September 27, 2025, where faculty members and student volunteers demonstrated smartphone usage, explained secure digital transactions, and guided senior citizens in accessing online government services.
- A Special Lecture on “Student Capacity in Emerging Technologies – Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Internet of Things (IoT)” was organized for first-year students under Sewa Parv-2025 during September 2025 to create awareness about emerging technologies and their applications.
- A session on the role of Bharatiya Bhasha in Teaching-Learning was organized under NEP 2020 and Sewa Parv-2025 on October 1, 2025, to encourage the use of Indian languages for inclusive and effective education.
- An Intellectual Property Awareness Program was organized under the aegis of the Intellectual Property Office, India, on October 9, 2025, to promote awareness of intellectual property rights and foster innovation and research.
- A Vaccination, Deworming and Vitamin-A Supplementation Camp was organized at Jay Jyoti School on October 10, 2025, benefiting around 120 children with the support of Anganwadi workers, teachers and parents.

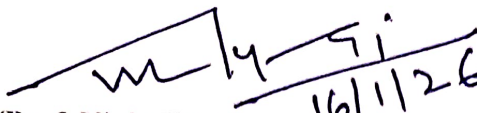
- Program Outcome and Course Outcome attainment analysis was presented for each program.

- Encourage faculty members to participate in professional development programmes.

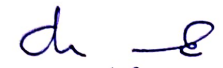
